Dear Friends in Christ,

The bishop and cabinet have offered Jim Bass the opportunity to be senior pastor for Friendswood UMC in Houston. This is a growing, dynamic church of about 3,000 members. It is entering an \$ 8 million building campaign and needs a pastor with creativity and excellent organizational skills. It is one of the lead churches in the conference, so only a handful of ministers were considered to be capable of effectively serving this church. Just a few days ago, Jim was offered this opportunity and he humbly accepted.

Both the needs and potential of Beaumont Wesley were recognized by the bishop and cabinet, and appointing a quality senior pastor was of paramount importance. To that end, Robert Besser has been appointed to Wesley. He is similar to Jim both in age and experience. He has shown excellent pastoral leadership at Kilgore St. Luke's for the last eight years. He is already making plans to meet with church leadership and prepare for his first Sunday in Beaumont on June 11.

Jim and Debbie have established deep friendships in Beaumont. As the church prepares for this pastoral change, you will want to find meaningful ways to say goodbye to them, even as you prepare to receive Robert and Pam as your new pastor family. The bishop and cabinet are confident that Robert Besser will bring excellent pastoral leadership to Wesley and to lead the church into God's future.

One final word is appropriate. This change in pastoral leadership originated with the cabinet's assessment of needs in churches across the conference. Jim Bass did not seek a move or request a move. In fact, Jim had made plans and established goals for Wesley that extended several years into the future. No one at Wesley asked for Jim to move. He was offered an unexpected opportunity and accepted the call.

This conference is blessed to have ministers like Jim Bass and Robert Besser who are called and equipped to serve the great churches of the Texas Annual Conference.

Rev. Robert D. Besser, ordained Elder of The Texas Annual Conference, wife, Rev. Pamela Stevenson Besser, and son, Barrett, have been appointed to Wesley United Methodist Church, effective June 1, 2006.

Robert is a native of Conroe, Texas. He attended Sam Houston State University, Huntsville, TX, for two years, completing his bachelor's degree in Christian Education from Centenary College of Louisiana, Shreveport, LA, 1988. He earned his Master of Divinity Degree in 1992, from Perkins School of Theology at SMU, Dallas, TX.

Rev. Besser has served in ministry with the Texas Annual Conference at: Bridges Chapel and Greenhill United Methodist churches, Mt. Pleasant, TX, while a student at Perkins, 1990-1992; Associate Pastor of First UMC, Pearland, TX, 1992-1995; Pastor of First UMC, Teague, TX, 1995-1998.

He is currently the Senior Pastor of St. Luke's UMC in Kilgore (1998-2006). St. Luke's web site is www.stlukeskilgore.com.

Both Robert and Pam have served on several District and Conference committees and boards and are very community minded. Robert has received the Denman Evangelism Award, the Eric Anderson Award for Leadership and the Bishop's Award for Excellence from the Texas Annual Conference.

Robert has always been very active in community activities and programs while serving as pastor to his congregations. He has been honored by receiving the Volunteer of the Year Award for 1997, Region #7, while serving on the Central Texas Council of Child Protection Boards, also serving as president. He has been recognized for his work with: Teague City Chamber of Commerce; the "Lord's Community Storehouse" food and clothing pantry; the "War-on-Drugs" Task Force; and the Heart of Texas Council of Governments Criminal Justice Advisory Committee.

While serving at St. Luke's UMC, Kilgore, Rev. Besser has served on: the Board of Directors of Laird Memorial Hospital, the Lon Morris College Board of Trustees, East Texas Piney Woods Chapter of the American Red Cross; the United Fund of Kilgore; Kilgore City Parks Committee; and the Lions Club. He has mentored scouts in the God and Country, God and Me, and God and Family Programs; has tutored at-risk students for Kilgore ISD schools; mentored individuals in the process of becoming full elders in the UMC.

During Robert's eight years with St. Luke's he has brought them into committed lay leadership, formulated vibrant children's and

youth ministries, lead in extensive repair and maintenance of the facilities infrastructure, established a long-term vision for ministry in the diversity of the Kilgore community, built a Habitat for Humanity house, built a youth building housing a gymnasium, classrooms, meeting room and kitchen. Under his leadership, St. Luke's membership has seen vital growth in new families and children's and youth ministries and lay leadership.

Rev. Pam Besser, earned her Bachelor's Degree in Christian Education from Centenary College, Shreveport, LA, and a Masters in Religious Education from Perkins School of Theology at SMU, Dallas, TX. She has served as Youth Minister at Pearland UMC, Youth Minister at St. Luke's UMC (1998-2003), and as Childrens and Senior Adult Minister (2003-present).

Robert enjoys relaxing by bike-riding, watching movies, and taking afternoon walks. Pam enjoys her time of relaxation by reading, quilt-making and other crafts. Barrett will begin the sixth grade this fall and enjoys playing football, baseball and basketball.

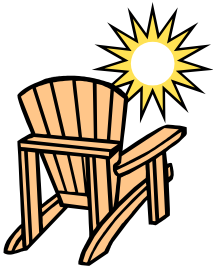
Calling Cards for the Troops...

James' Epistle

There is an old saying that goes, if you want to make God laugh, tell Him your plans. My plan had always been to stay at Wesley for a long time. I wanted my boys to go through school here. Debbie and I told many people that "we were on the decade plan." Those were my plans, but God it seems had other plans for me and Wesley. One of the things we have learned in the 40 Days of Purpose is that sometimes God's plans for us are different than the plans we have laid out for ourselves.

Dr. Richard Burnham, Beaumont District Superintendent, called late last week and asked that I go to Friendswood UMC in Houston. He said that after much prayer and discernment, the bishop and cabinet came to the belief that I was the one to lead Friendswood as they begin an eight million dollar building project. The bishop and cabinet did not come to this decision lightly, knowing I had been at Wesley for only two years, but strongly felt they were following God's leading in making this request.

One of the reasons the bishop and cabinet were lead to make this request was my experience at Wesley and Mission Bend. Both times I followed a pastor who led the church to relocate and then moved shortly after the relocation. Both times I came into a challenging transition and had to lead the church forward.

The Apostle Paul says, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to

his purpose." (Romans 8.28) I believe this promise. God is working out his purpose for us. Faith is following God's leading even when we don't understand.

The district superintendent assured me the bishop and cabinet would provide Wesley the pastoral leadership we needed to guide the church forward. I believe the bishop has done so by appointing Robert Besser as Senior Pastor and Mark Bunch as Associate Pastor. I have known both Robert and Mark for many years.

Robert Besser is a great pastor! He has provided outstanding leadership to the churches he served. He is currently at St. Luke's UMC in Kilgore where he has led that church for the past eight years. Under his leadership, St. Luke's has expanded their facilities and ministries and experienced sustained growth.

Robert is a man of deep faith. He is passionate about Jesus. He is outgoing and engaging. He is very personable, energetic and caring. He is a spiritual man whose love for Christ is evident in all he does. Robert is a strong, capable leader who will give outstanding leadership to Wesley. I have no doubt.

At the same time, the Bishop is appointing one of the best young ministers to be your new associate pastor. I have known Mark since he was in High School. He was in the youth group when I was an associate pastor at Alvin. I originally pursued Mark myself to follow Peter. I think the world of him and know that he is going to bring tremendous gifts for ministry here. Mark is one of those pastors that will someday lead churches like Wesley as a senior pastor. He is absolutely one of the best young pastors around.

I have been meditating on a scripture for the past several days. It is from 1 Corinthians 3.4-11

where the Apostle Paul wrote to a church that was confronting their own pastoral change. Here is what he writes.

One of you says, "I belong to Paul," and another says, "I belong to Apollos." When you say things like this, you are acting like people of the world.

Is Apollos important? No! Is Paul important? No! We are only servants of God who helped you believe. Each one of us did the work God gave us to do. I planted the seed, and Apollos watered it. But God is the One who made it grow. So the one who plants is not important, and the one who waters is not important. Only God, who makes things grow, is important. The one who plants and the one who waters have the same purpose, and each will be rewarded for his own work. We are God's workers, working together; you are like God's farm, God's house.

Using the gift God gave me, I laid the foundation of that house like an expert builder. Others are building on that foundation, but all people should be careful how they build on it. The foundation that has already been laid is Jesus Christ, and no one can lay down any other foundation.


Wesley is in good hands. You have a great pastoral team coming. Keep them and their families in your prayers. Together Wesley will continue to build on the foundation of Jesus Christ and go forward in faith to fulfill the plans God has for this great church.

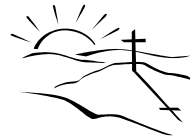
