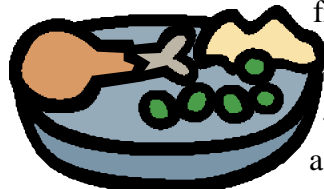
Mid-Week Boost Is Coming!

Boys Haven is always so appreciative of our work with them...and I am so appreciative of your support of this ministry!

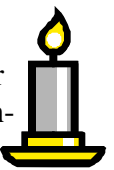

Music Ministry

“IV. Sing lustily and with a good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead, or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength.”

Near the front of your United Methodist Hymnal, you find a list of rules titled “Directions For Singing.” They are taken from John Wesley's *Select Hymns*. This one is my favorite. I'm surrounded by musicians everywhere I go, at church, at Lamar, in the community. Some of them are highly trained, others not. My children sing joyfully in the tub each night. People in the car next to me at the red light are singing along with the radio, unbothered by who notices their performance.

We are all singers. I believe no matter what our musical ability is, we are all meant to sing! Each day is a gift given to us and what better way to give thanks. I really believe God smiles when He hears our voices raised in song. (He probably even laughs from time to time.) I think He appreciates our efforts. On Sunday mornings, stand tall and let your voice be heard. Whether it's your favorite hymn or one you've never even heard before, just take in the message and the melody and give it your all. “This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it!”



“Above all, sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing.” This comes from rule number 7. Aim to please Him, to praise Him, to *thank* Him, “so shall your singing be such as the Lord will approve.”
