From Our Pastors

Bishop Huie's visit to Wesley

Sunday's visit from our bishop was very comforting. She con-

veyed not only her personal prayers and support for Wesley, but as well the Texas Annual Conference's commitment to serve the 200+ United Methodist churches and institutions within the bounds of the conference that suffered damage from Ike. Please read her letter that arrived today:

Dear Friends,

Grace and peace in the name of the God of Hope.

As the damage reports from Hurricane Ike have rolled in over the last two weeks, I have become aware that the scope and quantity of property loss far exceeds anything the Texas Annual Conference has ever encountered. We now have reports of **damage to more than 200 United Methodist structures**. For communities recovering from Hurricane Rita just three years ago, Ike's blow threatens to overwhelm their sense of confidence in the future. In addition, the economic uncertainty in our nation and world is eliciting anxiety in almost everyone.

At the same time, my heart overflows with thanksgiving for your generous response to the relief and recovery process. You have already contributed thousands of volunteer hours and brought water, food, chainsaws and flood buckets to affected areas. In order for people to put their lives in order again, we will need your continued prayers, time and skills for many

months.

We also need your generous financial support to deal with catastrophic expenses in communities and congregations. Many of you are already responding to my email appeal last week for a special offering for Hurricane Ike Recovery. However, I have become aware that a substantial group of pastors and lay persons (many areas continue without power) are unaware of my request.

Our greatest concerns are the following:

- Three-four months compensation for pastors whose congregations have evacuated and/or where whole communities are dispersed such as congregations on Bolivar Peninsula, Galveston, Sabine Pass and Bridge City.
- Assistance with church and parsonage clean up and reconstruction.
- Many families, churches and parsonages had inadequate or no flood insurance.
- Assistance for families who have simply run out of money for food, gas and necessities due to two consecutive evacuation orders. Assistance with home clean up and reconstruction in communities with greatest need.

Three years ago you contributed over \$1 million dollars for Rita Recovery. UMCOR contributed \$4 million. Because of your generosity and the generosity of UMC people around the world, nearly 850 homes in Southeast Texas were re-built. **The need for Ike Recovery will be much greater.**

We have learned a great deal in the last three years. For example,

we have learned that volunteer hours double every dollar given to recovery. We know that the early response of the UMC invites other groups to engage with us and stay committed to long-term recovery. Whatever you give in time and money is multiplied many times over.

We pray and trust that United Methodists nationally will be generous once again. We also know that we have personal responsibility to our friends and neighbors.

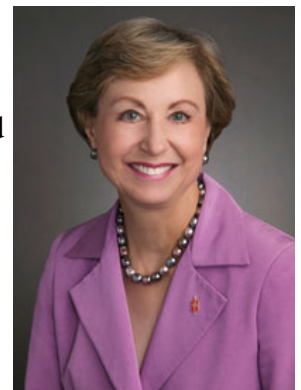

"Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints. Extend hospitality to strangers."

I am confident that your joy, patience, prayer, hospitality and generosity in response to this disaster will change lives and re-shape futures for Jesus Christ.

Note from Your Health Care Ministries Team: Flu Season is Almost Here

October begins flu season, and the best way to prevent the flu is to get your flu vaccination each year. Who should get the flu shot? The CDC recommends it in particular for pregnant women; adults over 50; child care workers or health care workers; children 6 months to 5 years old; anyone with a chronic medical condition such as asthma, kidney disease, lung disease, heart disease, diabetes, HIV or a weakened immune system; and those who are residents in nursing homes or chronic-care facilities.

To protect yourself (and others) during flu season, remember these important tips: practice good hygiene by washing hands thoroughly and often with soap and water or an alcohol-based sanitizer; avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth; avoid crowds if the flu is prevalent; and cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.

Be sure to ask your doctor if the flu shot is right for you! For more information, contact the Beaumont Health Department at 832-4000 or the Center for Disease Control, 800-232-4636.

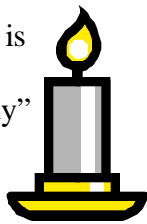
