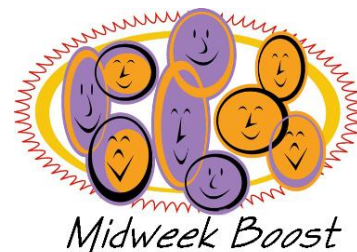
Kitchen Volunteers For Mid Week Boost Needed

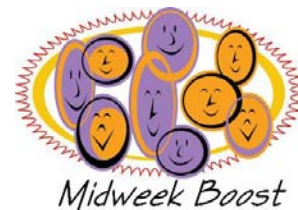

9:15am Interpreted Service

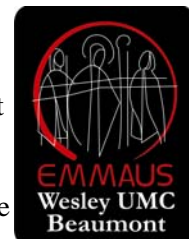

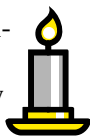
